- Thank you to Silver Spur Chairmen **Nick Lentini** and **Brian Koegle** and the Foundation staff for another very successful event!

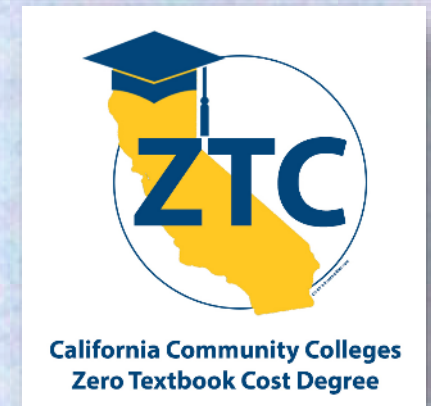




# COC GRADUATE WINS GLOBAL AWARD FOR PROMOTING OER AT COC!

18 of our programs have been named “**Strong Workforce Stars**” by the California Community Colleges Chancellor’s Office!

- Programs must have demonstrated the following outcomes, based on Strong Workforce Program LaunchBoard data:
  - ✓ An increase in earnings by **50%** or more, based on a match to the state wage file, for students who were last enrolled in 2015-16;
  - ✓ Attainment of the regional living wage by **70%** or more, based on a match to the state wage file, for students who were last enrolled in 2015-16; and
  - ✓ **90%** or more are employed in a job similar to their field of study, according to the CTE Outcomes Survey, for students who were last enrolled in 2014-15.

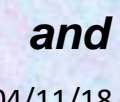

- ✓ **3** Fifth Place medals.



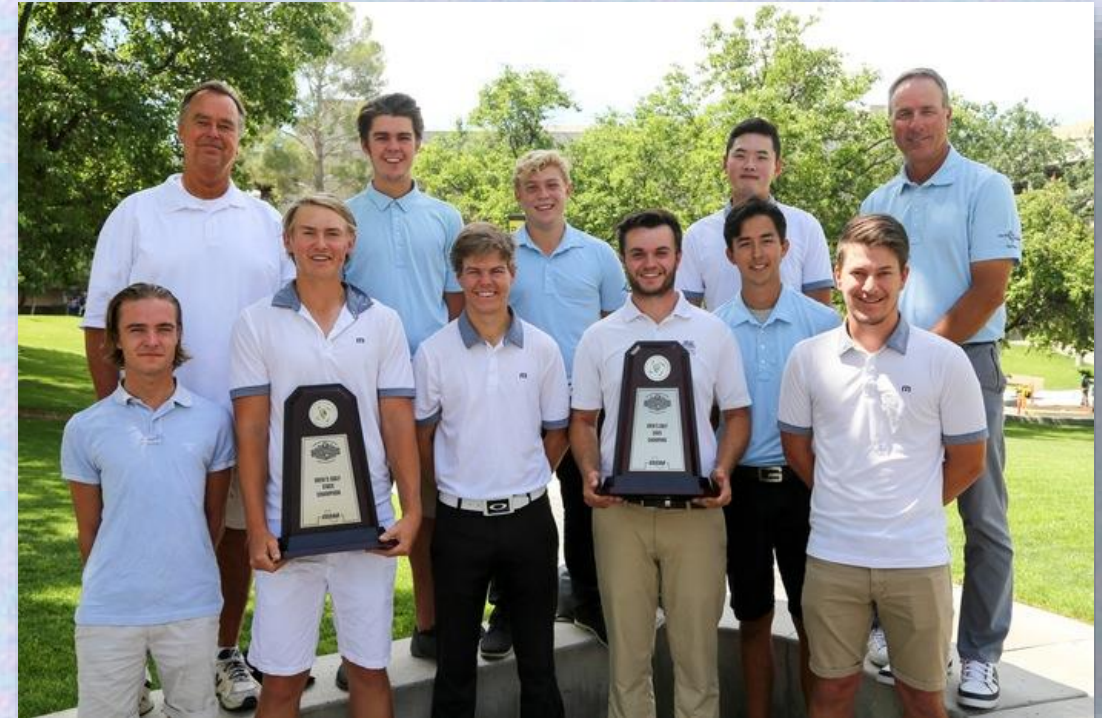
- Over **175** students from colleges and universities across California participated, including students from UC San Diego, UC Riverside, USC and CSU Fullerton.

# 2017 STATE CHAMPIONSHIP GOLF TEAM EARNS ANOTHER HONOR!

Our 2017 State Championship Men's Golf Team has been named a **CCCAA Scholar Team Award Winner!**

- This is the highest academic team achievement given annually by the California Community College Athletic Association (CCCAA).
- It emphasizes the academic achievement of all members of one specific team, with **only one team selected from each CCCAA sport in the state.**
- To be eligible, all team members must have excelled academically with a total GPA of 3.0 or higher and have demonstrated better than average accomplishments in intercollegiate athletic competition. **Our team had a combined GPA of 3.66!**
- This is a special accomplishment for this State Championship Team, which included several international student-athletes who also had to navigate through language barriers and cultural differences.
- At the end of the season, this team saw eight players transfer to four-year NCAA universities to continue competing and pursuing their academic goals.

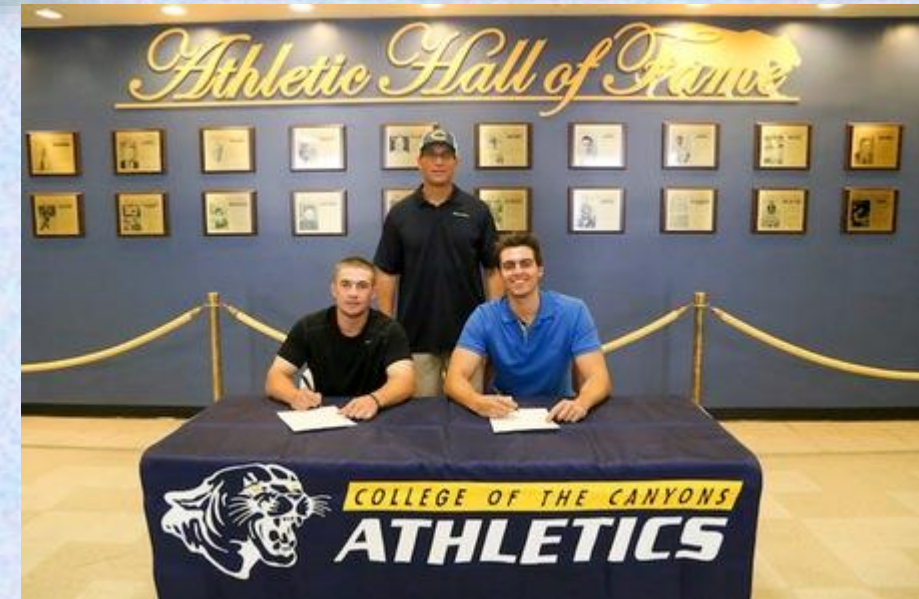




# BASEBALL PLAYER NAMED TO CCCAA SCHOLAR ATHLETE HONOR ROLL

- Justin is currently attending New Mexico State University and pitching for the Aggies baseball program.

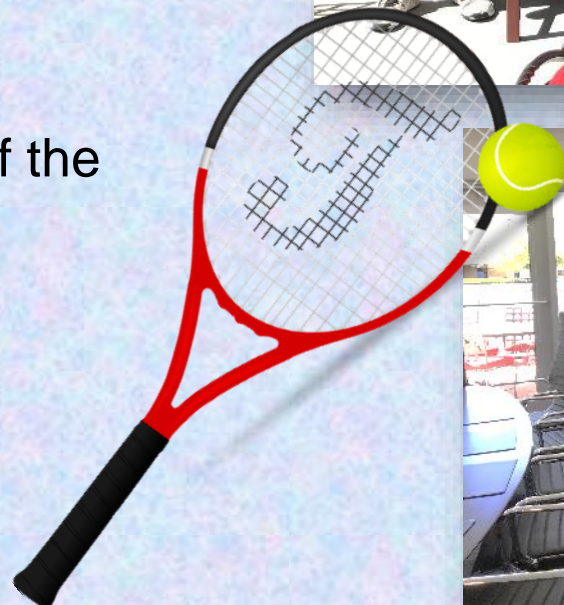




# WOMEN'S INAUGURAL TENNIS TEAM

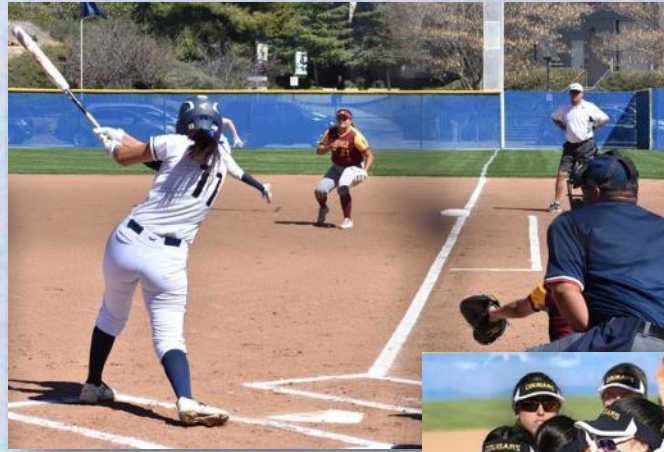


# ATHLETIC UPDATE

- Nearly a thousand people walked and raised funds for this local non-profit that assists children diagnosed with cancer and their families.

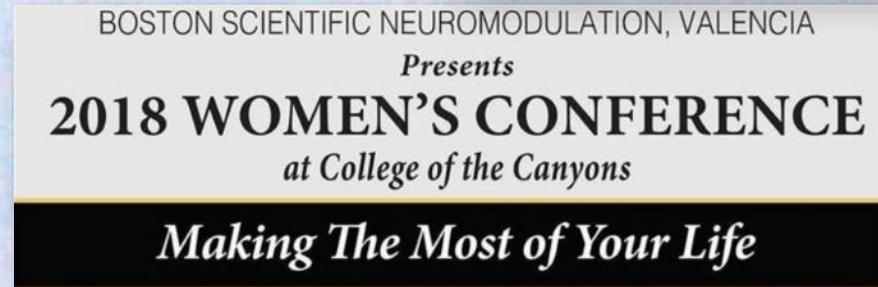




# “MAKING THE MOST OF YOUR LIFE” – WOMEN’S CONFERENCE

- A special thank you to many of our COC staff members and Foundation Board members who participated as speakers and sponsors of this conference.

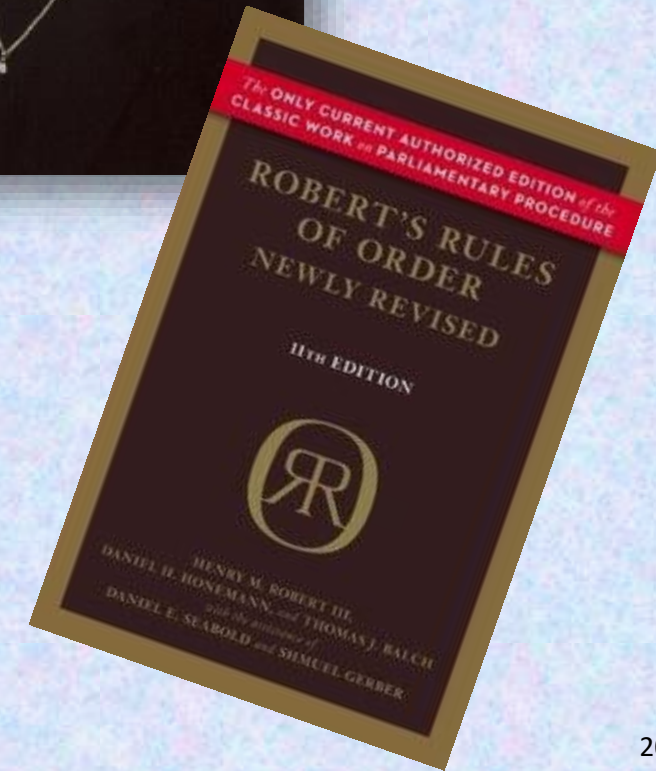




# DONNA MILLER PROVIDES EFFECTIVE MEETING WORKSHOP

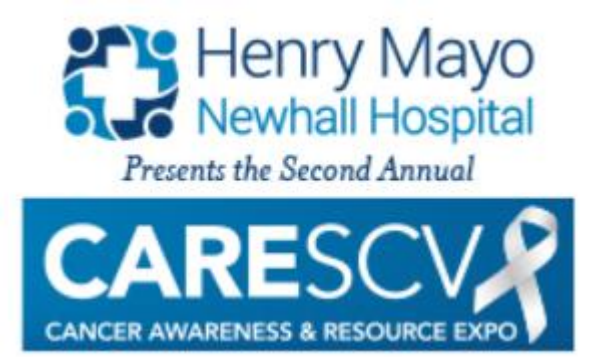




# CANCER AWARENESS AND RESOURCE EXPO

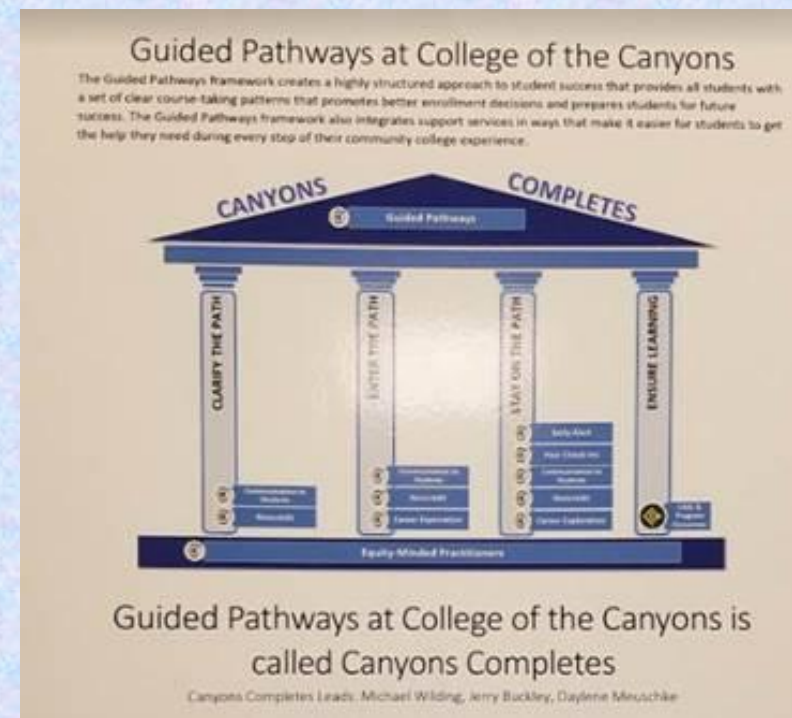




# TEAM COC ATTENDS ADVANCED GUIDED PATHWAYS WORKSHOP

- As expected, the event sparked intense discussion.

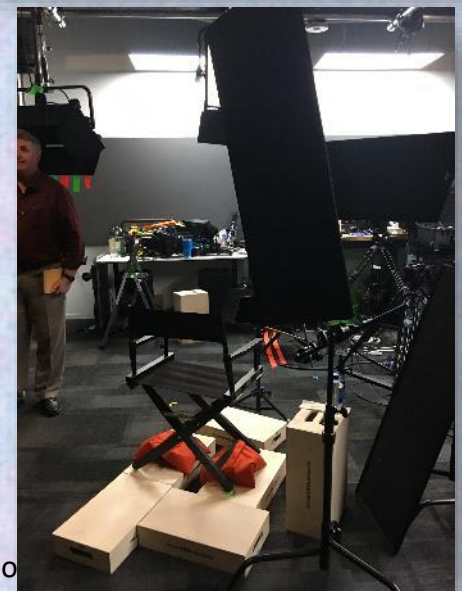
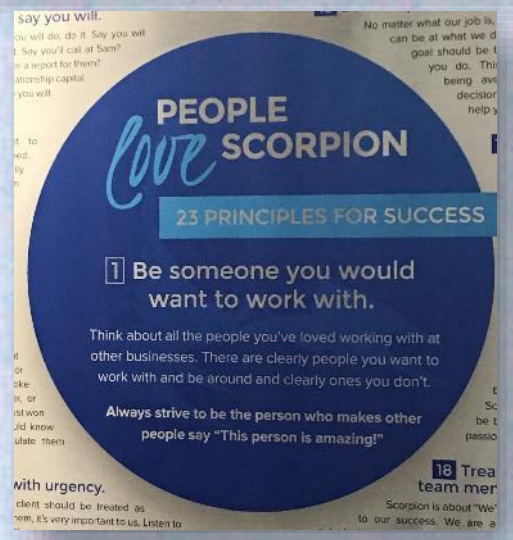




# COC TOURS SCORPION INTERNET MARKETING

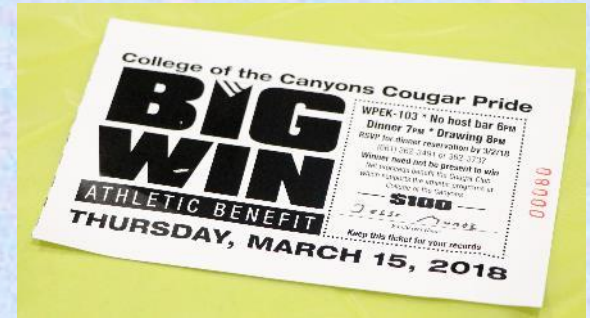




# BIG WIN!

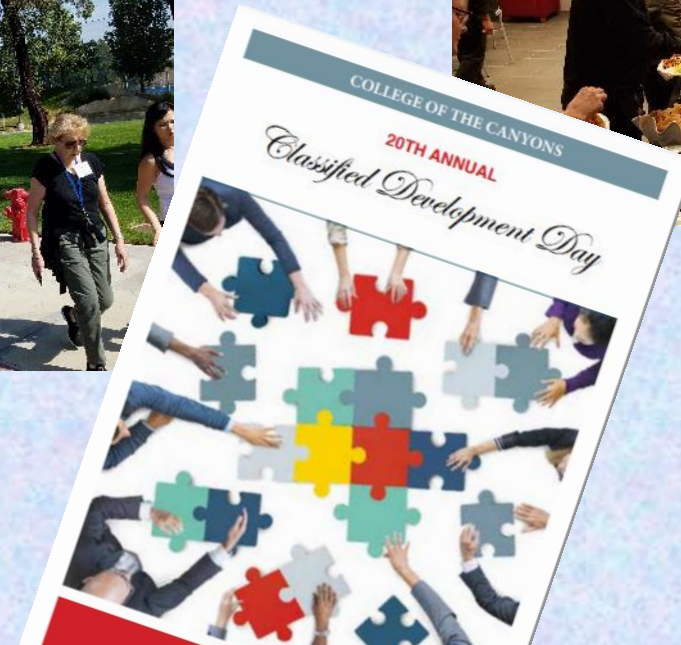




# CELEBRATING OUR CLASSIFIED STAFF!

- The keynote speaker was Dr. Veronica Neal, Certified Diversity Professional, who spoke on “***Call-In Culture for Advancing Equity***”.







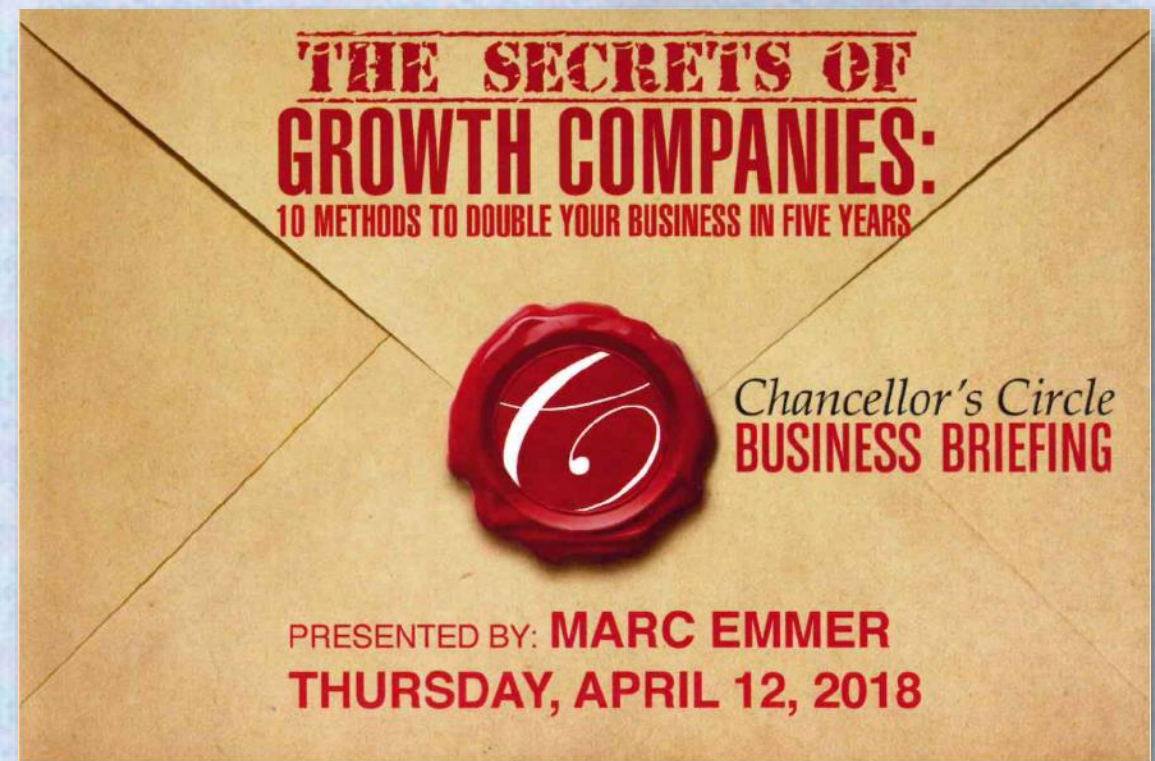

- Attendees at the Wine & Cheese event will receive a complimentary copy of "**Momentum: How Companies Decide What To Do Next**".

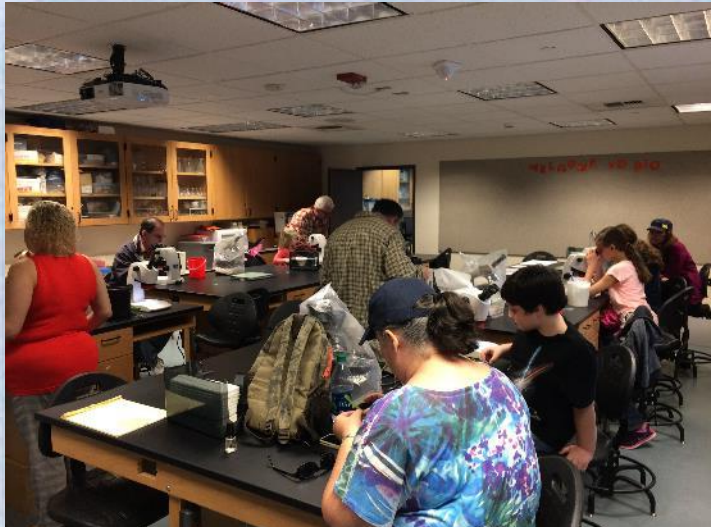




# GARDEN WALK AT CANYON COUNTRY CAMPUS

- A reception for the artists will be held from noon to 4 pm on Tuesday, April 17<sup>th</sup>.

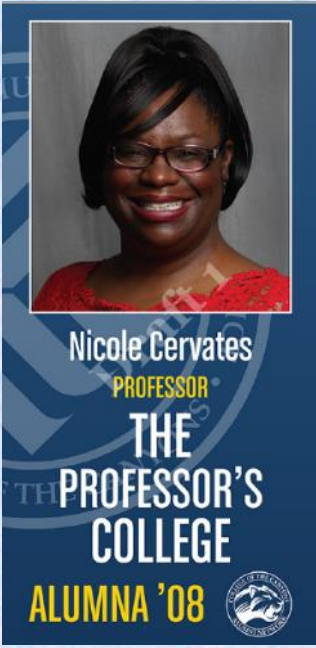
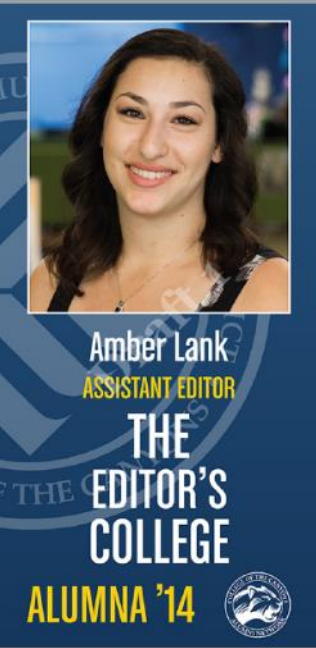
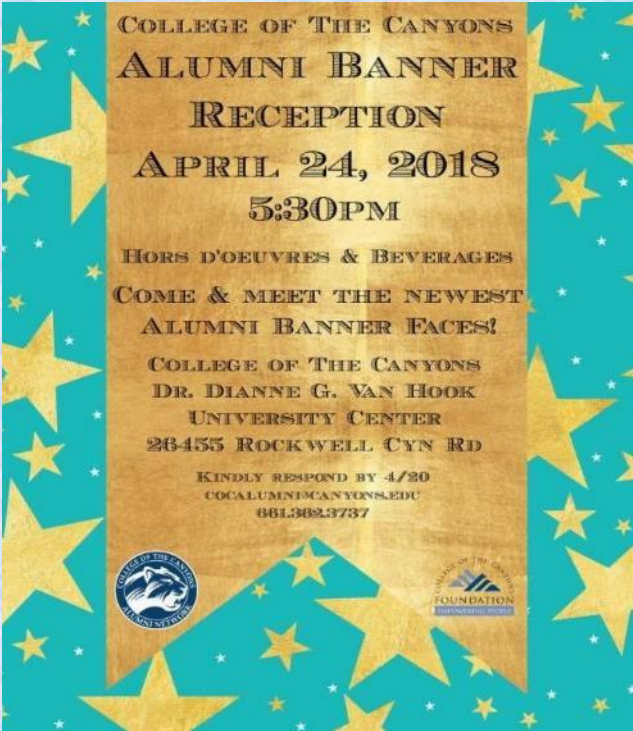
