The Center for Early Childhood Education marked it's 35<sup>th</sup> anniversary with a celebration on Saturday, August 19<sup>th</sup>.

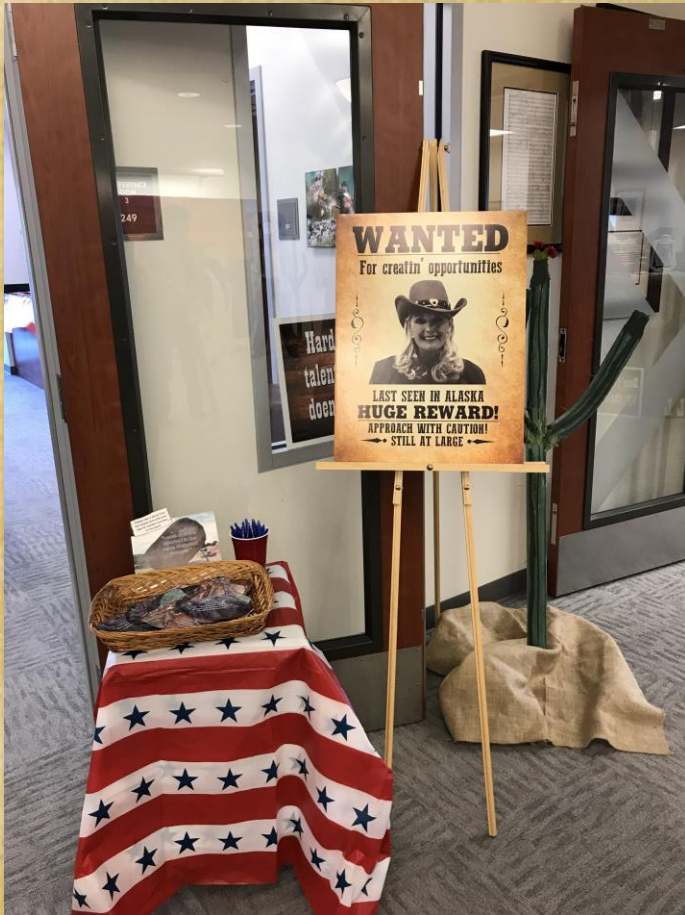
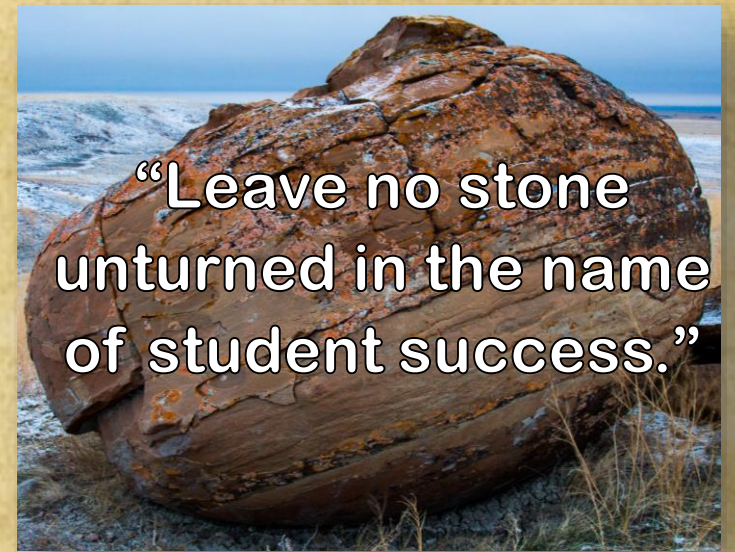
- The event was attended by current and former students, some who now have children attending the Center, as well as teachers and community members.

# COLLEGE LEADERS JOIN STATEWIDE EFFORT TO EXPAND COLLEGE PROMISE

On August 30<sup>th</sup> representatives from COC joined more than **400** education leaders as part of a statewide effort to improve and expand College Promise partnerships.

- During the conference, educational leaders heard from the heads of **all** public education systems in California and discussed the key elements of successful College Promise Programs.
- Currently there are nearly **55** College Promise Programs in community colleges throughout the state.
- COC launched First-year Promise this Fall through a **\$750,000** grant from the California Community College Chancellor's Office.
- Under the leadership of COC Foundation Board Chairman Steve Corn, COC is currently exploring fundraising opportunities to extend the benefits of the First Year Promise Program beyond the term of the grant.
- The representatives from COC gained important information, including how to engage businesses in supporting the program and how to make it sustainable.





# ISP WELCOMES NEW STUDENTS – SEPTEMBER 6

The International Student Program (ISP) held a barbeque on Wednesday, September 6<sup>th</sup> to welcome **58** new ISP students this semester and to celebrate the successes of the program.

- **47** of the **200** ISP students earned a **perfect GPA** of 4.0 during the Spring 2017 semester!
- The COC Chinese speaking population has grown from **3** students in Spring 2015 to close to **50** students in Fall 2017!
- More than **150** Chinese middle and high school students were on campus this summer to check out our campus and see if they would like to study here in the future.
- We now have **4** partner schools in China that have students tracked to attend COC from their first day of high school. The first cohort of **12** students has now arrived and begun their studies here at COC!
- Three new student clubs have been formed by ISP students.

# EQUITY SUMMIT – SEPTEMBER 8

Eleven members of our staff attended the Community College League of California Equity Summit on September 8<sup>th</sup> in Ontario, CA.

- The theme of the summit was **“Equity 2017: Elevating Equity for Social Mobility”**.
- The League hosted an inspiring conference to discuss student success, equity and social mobility.
- Sessions were informative and included:
  - ✓ Equity from the perspective of students;
  - ✓ Relationships between equity gaps in education and empathy gaps in our culture;
  - ✓ Services for low-income, newly arrived and historically underserved students;
  - ✓ Mobility out of poverty and the role of education from the perspective of the LA Chamber of Commerce; and
  - ✓ The social mobility challenge – serving homeless and housing-insecure students.
- Additionally, the math transformation work at COC was highlighted in a new publication by the League and the RP Group – **“Elevating Equity for Social Mobility”**.



# COC PARTNERS WITH LINCOLN ELECTRIC TO PROVIDE TRAINING

COC has become the first official Lincoln Electric Education Partner School (LEEPS) in the nation by providing certified robotic training to Lincoln Electric clients.

- This is a multi-tiered program that provides industry certification to welders who meet specific program requirements.
- Prior to this partnership, Lincoln Electric clients on the west coast had to travel to Cleveland, Ohio for training.
- During the three-day training students learn structured programming language techniques, proper editing procedures and error recovery through hands-on exercises in a lecture/laboratory format.
- The first three-day training was held at COC from August 15<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> and the next session will be held from December 12<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup>.
- Lincoln Electric is considered the world leader in the manufacture, development and design of robotic arc welding systems, arc welding, as well as oxyfuel and plasma cutting equipment.
- We are lucky that Tim Baber is a leader in this arena. He is certainly blazin' new trails!



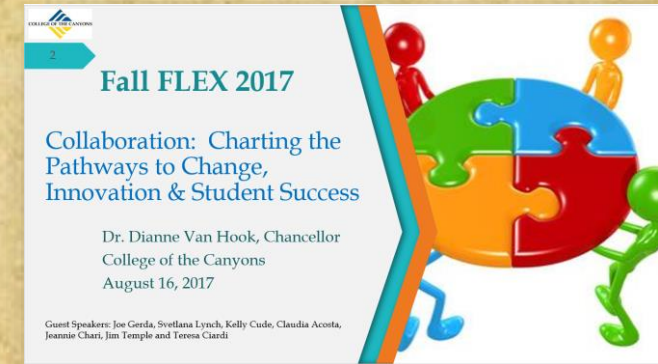

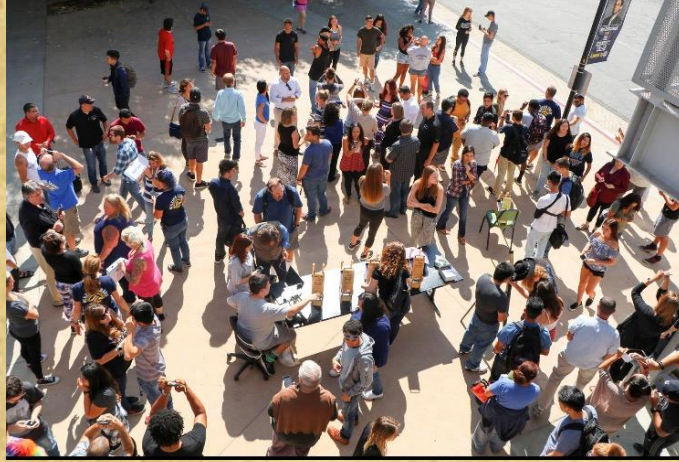




# ECLIPSE DAY – AUGUST 21

On Tuesday, August 29<sup>th</sup> the iCue resumed its weekly lunch service.

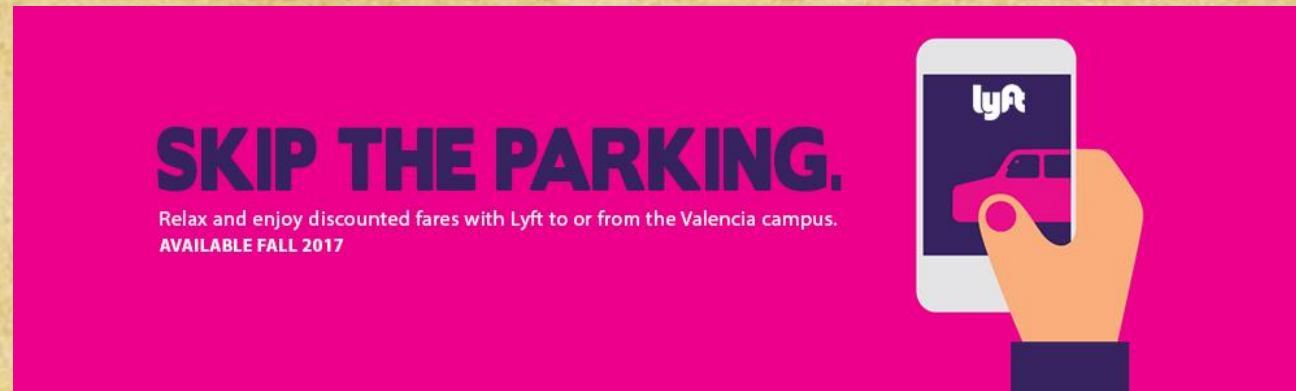
- Our student run laboratory café will again offer a five-course prix fixe lunch from 11 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

# SKIP PARKING!

The college recently began offering discounted fares with Lyft for the Fall 2017 semester.

- Students, employees and campus visitors can take advantage of this service and avoid driving to or from the Valencia Campus.
- Service is limited to the first 880 users who enter a special code into their Lyft profiles.
- There are no time or day restrictions when the code can be used.
- The \$5 discount covers up to 5 miles using Lyft Line (the shared option) or Lyft. If you commute under 5 miles the ride is free!
- Lyft drivers usually drop off and pick up from the traffic circle in front of Canyons Hall.



# RISE PROJECT LAUNCHED

COC recently launched the Resources for Individual Success in Education (RISE) Project to help improve access to higher education for current and former foster or homeless youth.

- The mission of this program is to increase retention, graduation and transfer rates, as well as promote student learning and development.
- The RISE Project will provide students with counseling, priority registration, progress monitoring and assistance with the purchase of textbooks, meals and transportation.
- RISE Project students will have access to on-campus shower facilities, personal care supplies, workshops, snacks and resources referrals.
- Dora Lozano is the RISE Project Counselor.

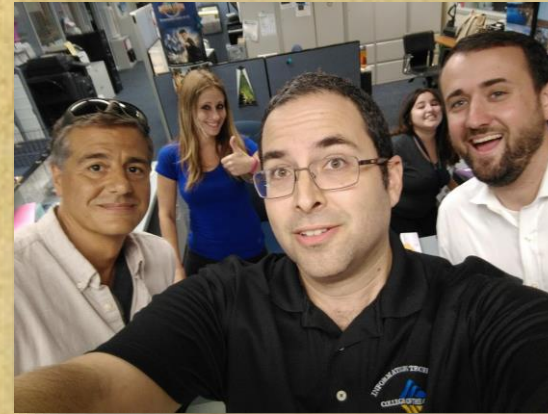

MAC held an on-campus scavenger hunt on September 5<sup>th</sup> as part of a team building exercise and to experience what our students go through in finding different locations around our campus.

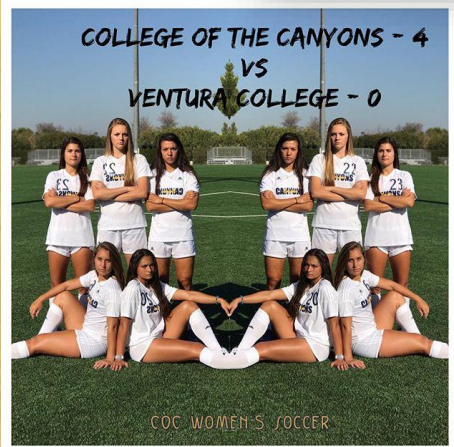
- Teams of MAC members had a list of 24 on-campus locations to visit and had to walk or drive a car (no carts) to get to each location.

# ATHLETIC UPDATE

COC Athletics are underway!

- **Football** - Canyons is 2-0 heading into this weekend's home opener vs. No. 1 ranked defending state champion Fullerton College. The Cougars picked up a 42-30 victory over AVC in week one, then defeated Orange Coast 30-14 last Saturday. This season all COC football home games will be LIVE STREAMED via SoCalCollegeSports.com.
- **Volleyball** - Canyons is currently the No. 3 ranked team in the state according to the first CCCVCA top-25 poll of the season. The Cougars are sporting a 5-1 record heading into tonight's matchup vs. Long Beach City College. COC sophomore outside hitter Emily Burns was recently named the Western State Conference female athlete of the week.
- **Women's Soccer** - Canyons continues to be included in the national rankings, with the No. 11 Cougars moving up five spots in the most recent United Soccer Coaches Association Junior College Division III poll. Canyons is currently 5-0 heading into this Friday's road matchup with No. 3 ranked Chaffey College.

COC Athletics are underway!

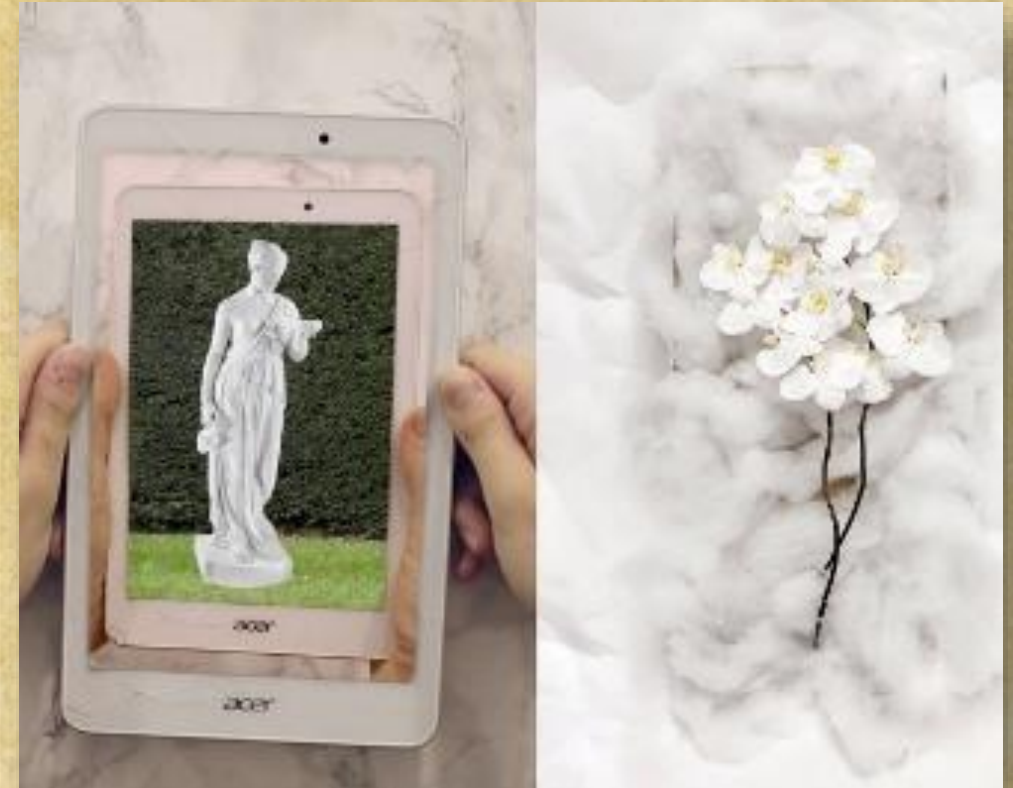
- **Men's Soccer** - Canyons dipped below the .500 mark after a tough 4-1 loss to Chaffey College on Tuesday night. Over the weekend, the Cougars were a 3-2 winner vs. Mendocino College while playing at the annual NorCal Community College Showcase.
- **Cross Country** - The COC cross country program has enjoyed a successful start to the year, highlighted by a season-opening first place finish from the women's team. Last weekend, both programs competed at the annual Fresno Invitational with the men's team running to a 13th place ranking and the women's team finishing third. On Friday, Canyons will host the CCCAA Southern California Preview at Central Park.
- **Women's Golf** - Canyons has placed second at the first two conference events of the season. On Monday, COC freshman JoJo Roeker bested the tournament field with a round of 73 at Santa Barbara Golf Club to earn medalist honors.

- All gallery exhibitions are free and open to the public.

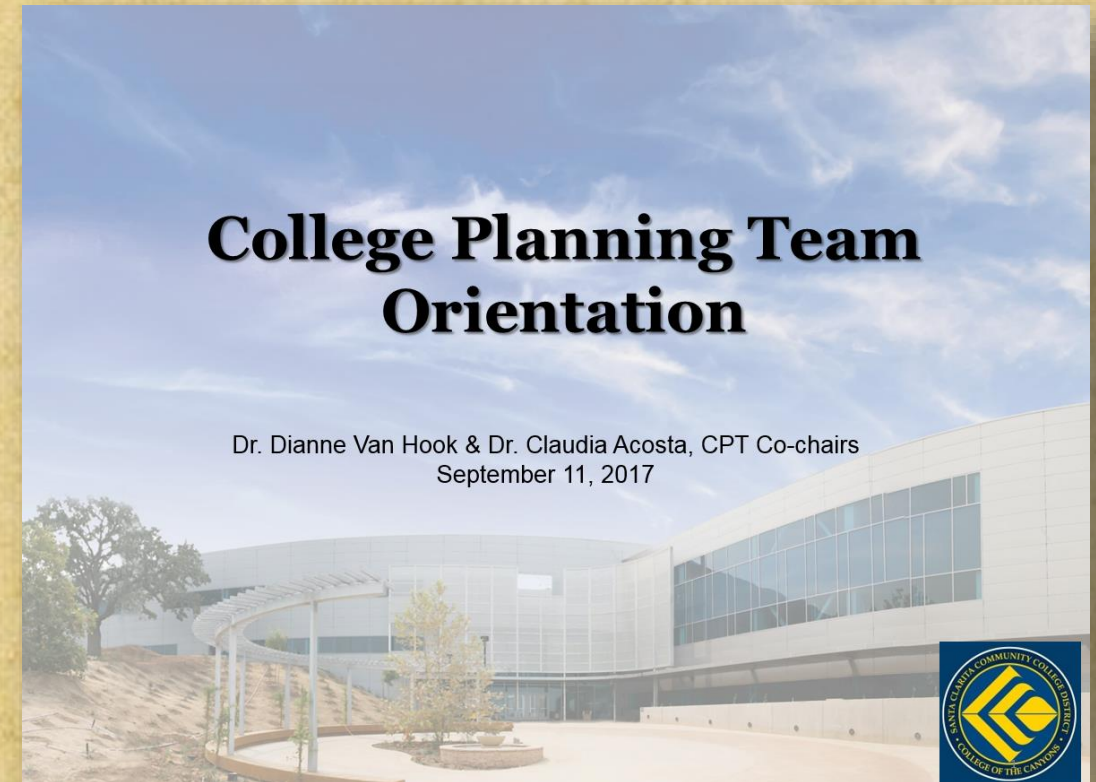




# CPT ORIENTATION – SEPTEMBER 11
