Instead, he channeled his energy into academics, becoming the **first** COC student-athlete to join the college's **Aerospace and Science Team (AST)**, earning the opportunity to lead a NASA student platform project, and eventually walking away with a **3.71 GPA** and **five** associate degrees as a member of the college's 2021 graduating class.




LEAP Team Presentations

 - Student Sustainability Initiative Incubator










Aerospace & Science Team Update

The Aerospace and Science Team is moving forward on two major projects. Its NASA RockSat-X experiment has been mounted on the rocket, and pre-launch testing has begun.

- > Student leads hope to travel to NASA's Wallops Launch Facility for the Aug. 11th launch.
- Students continue to make progress on the team's NASA HASP experiment.
- HASP pre-launch testing is scheduled July 26th to 30th.
- NASA has approved student teams to be present at the Columbia Scientific Balloon Facility in Palestine, Texas, and student leaders hope to travel there for integration and testing.
- ➤ HASP will take flight from **Fort Sumner**, **New Mexico**, with a launch window commencing on **Sept. 2**nd. No other teams in these two programs are tackling **two** NASA missions simultaneously.

Edison Awards Fire Technology Scholarships

Nine College of the Canyons Fire Technology students have received \$1,000 scholarships from Edison International to cover tuition, books and school-related fees.

- The students had to have a cumulative GPA of 2.7 or higher, be enrolled in the college's Fire Technology Program, and respond to four essay questions about their fire service career goals.
- The scholarships were awarded through a \$25,000 grant from Edison International in support of the college's development of present and future fire personnel.
- This is the **fourth** year in a row that Edison International awarded a grant to the college's fire technology program.









Law Enforcement Technology to Debut

The college is launching a first-of-its kind Law Enforcement Technology program focused on emerging trends and potential applications for new technologies in criminal investigations and other law enforcement operations.

- The first in the nation, the program *starts this fall* and allows students to earn an **associate degree** or **professional** certificate in this emerging field.
- Students will gain insight into how technology impacts law enforcement, the many legal issues associated with technological uses, ethical boundaries considerations, along with operational and investigative techniques.
- Course subjects include: Crime and the Internet, Computer Forensics, Digital Evidence Acquisition, Network Security Investigations, and Electronic Surveillance and Tracking.

Stealth Training Program to Launch

This fall, College of the Canyons will be the *only* community college in the state to offer a Low Observable (stealth) Coatings Application Training Program.

- Launching in partnership with Northrop Grumman, the 12-week program will train students on how to apply sspecial coatings to aircraft, missiles and other defense systems that will allow them to operate undetected.
- Students enrolled in the online program will learn from subject matter experts about low observable fundamentals and proper application techniques.
- A portion of the **130-hour** course will include use of an on-site and in-person virtual simulator.
- Interested participants are encouraged to attend one of the upcoming information sessions: Wednesday, June 23
 @ 10 a.m. or Thursday, June 24 @ 6 p.m.









Final Summer Session Starts Next Week

Summer classes are in session and registration is ongoing, with **Session 4** set to start **July 12**.

- Registration also continues for the fall semester, which kicks off August 23.
- More than **800 sections** of high-demand core classes are being offered this summer, and nearly **2,000 more** will be offered in both on-campus and remote formats this fall.

BaNC Fall 2020 Highlights

- > 4300 grocery cards distributed to students.
- > \$100,000 of federal COVID block grants awarded to students with past due rent, mortgage and/or utility bills.
- Food drive co-sponsored with *Rotary Club of SCV* netted **200** pantry bags of Thanksgiving-themed food.
- Those bags were distributed to students for "BaNCsGiving" along with \$50 grocery cards.

BaNC Spring 2021 Highlights

- > 700 grocery cards paired with Culinary boxed lunches distributed to students
- > 218 CalFresh applications submitted by students (57 in June alone!)
- ▶ 1050 grocery cards will be distributed through the AVP, Student Services office during summer 2021
- > Rotary Club of SCV awarded a \$4,750 grant to the BaNC.
